

Caroline Bailey Green

July 12, 1926 - February 24, 2017

Caroline Bailey Green passed away at home in Windermere on Friday, Feb. 24, 2017, surrounded by her family. She was 90 years old.

Caroline was born in Thomasville, Georgia, to Marjorie and George Bailey, both Florida natives. She spent many summers with family in Gainesville and Monticello. She was raised in Englewood, New Jersey, graduating from Dwight School.

She attended Wellesley College but left early to marry the love of her life, Jesse Green, who was a West Point graduate. She later graduated from Huntington College (Alabama) with a degree in elementary education.

Caroline was predeceased by her husband of 67 years, Jesse Green; her sister, Sue Mason; brother, George Bailey, and son-in-law, Paul Seibel. She is survived by her four children, Michael Green (Hiroko), Patricia Green, Marjorie Malloy (Mike) and Judy Green; as well as 10 grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews.

Carol and Jesse raised their four children during Jesse's 30-year career in the Air Force. They lived in California, Japan, Florida, Okinawa, Hawaii, South Carolina, Alabama, Thailand and Texas, moving 11 times in 30 years. Despite their many moves across and outside the country, they nurtured and maintained strong ties with family and friends by making it a priority to spend time with friends and family as much as possible.

She and Jesse shared a love for both water- and snow-skiing and skied well into their 80s.

The Greens moved to Windermere in 1976 after Jesse's retirement from the Air Force and purchased their beloved home of 40 years on Windermere's Second Avenue. Caroline was loved by friends and neighbors for her generosity and legendary hospitality. Carol went out of her way to meet new neighbors and introduce them to other neighbors to make them feel at home.

She taught reading for many years and later worked with Jesse in their print shop in Winter Garden. She was an active longtime volunteer for Edgewood Children's Ranch, Orange County elementary reading programs and Church of the Messiah.

With Jesse she was a strong supporter of the Rotary Club of Windermere and West Orange Habitat for Humanity. Carol remained active throughout her life with bridge club, Tai-Chi, line dancing, garden club, book group and Bible study. She and Jesse loved to travel, visiting their children across the U.S. and planning fantastic family reunions in far-flung places. The Green family Mediterranean cruise was a highlight, bringing together children and grandchildren to celebrate Carol's 80th birthday.

A memorial service will be held at 3 p.m. Monday, March 13, at the Church of the Messiah in Winter Garden. Donations to West Orange Habitat for Humanity are requested in lieu of flowers.

The 2017 100th Anniversary of our Rotary Foundation will be one of the greatest experiences you will ever have in your Rotary lifetime. This is your time to see and understand what you have accomplished while experiencing the friendship of tens of thousands of Rotarians from around the world. There are currently over **31,000 Rotarians registered** and another **8,000 waiting for visa clearances**.

The Host Organizing Committee (HOC) is dedicated to delivering to you the best of Rotary and the best fun in Rotary, but... **WE STILL NEED YOUR HELP!!!!!!**

There are almost **4,400 Zone 34 Rotarians registered for the Convention**, and only approximately 3% of you have signed up to be volunteers at the convention. The host areas usually have up to 50% of their registered Rotarians signed up as volunteers. The success of the convention will be determined by many factors. One of the most important will be the volunteer support. The volunteer effort is designed to make sure that Rotarians from all over the world have an enjoyable experience during their stay in Atlanta. As such, the volunteers have several responsibilities.

These are...

1. Welcome traveling Rotarians at the airport. Greet them with true **SOUTHERN HOSPITALITY**.
2. Direct them to the luggage areas and then to the taxis or MARTA areas.
3. Support the House of Friendship as greeters.
4. Provide Rotary visibility and ticket taking at HOC events.
5. Staff the HOC ticket booth (HOC events).
6. Stuff "goodie" bags.

Volunteers are expected to serve **one four hour** commitment. You can serve more if you choose to do so. Also, some group leaders will have six hour sessions to ensure a smooth transition between volunteer groups. Most of these commitments will not interfere with any Convention plenary sessions. Each volunteer will be provided with a commemorative vest and hat, and a special volunteer pin that you can keep. You will also have a training session provided during the late 1st quarter of 2017 and then repeated prior to the Convention. You will be provided with a MARTA pass.
