

Gregory Lee Winters, D.V.M., 84, beloved husband, father, and grandfather, passed away October 26, 2018. Dr. Winters was born to Ruth Lazauskas and James Lee Winters on October 4, 1934, in Baltimore, Maryland. Upon graduation from high school, he attended the pre-veterinary program at the University of Maryland. In 1955, he entered the School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Georgia. After graduation, he joined the United States Air Force and served as base veterinarian at MacDill AFB in Tampa, FL. In September of 1961, he opened the Pine Hills Veterinary Clinic in Orlando, FL. In 1986, he built the Animal Clinic of Windermere. He retired in July, 2000. Dr. Winters was an avid tennis player until he became ill. In his younger years, he loved water skiing and scuba diving. He made many scuba trips to Central America and Mexico. He and his wife, Cherry, of 61 years, loved to travel. They visited most of the United States and much of Europe and South America. Their most treasured memories are of their three trips to Africa. Dr. Winters was a member of Kappa Alpha Order. He was a past president of the **Central Florida** Veterinary Medical Association, and he was also a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association. Dr. Winters is predeceased by his son James Gregory Winters. He is survived by his wife Cherry; his daughters Lee Anne Kline of Windermere and Elizabeth Paige Winters of Daytona Beach; his grandchildren Krista Marie, Daniel Christian, and Victoria Lee Kline of Windermere; and his brother Dudley Winters and his wife Caroline of Baltimore, MD. A celebration of life will be held at Woodlawn Memorial Park and Funeral Home on Saturday, November 3rd at 2pm.

Note: Greg was a wonderful man, friend, neighbor, Veteran and veterinarian in Windermere who took good care of many of our pets. We will miss him, and our prayers are with Cherry and the family.

OUR ROTARY FAMILY

Military Town

Eglin Joint Base Command located near Ft. Walton, Florida, is presently the largest Military Complex in the world and encompasses a large contingent of Air Force units, Naval Warfare units, and the 7th Army Special Forces and 6th Army Rangers.

My home is exactly 5 miles outside the main gate of Eglin AFB.

Most folks in the USA don't live in a Military Town, with lots of guys in uniform walking the streets and jets overhead daily. They go on with their lives unaware of what a Military Town is all about. And that's OK... but I want to share with you what it's like to live in a Military Town. We see guys in uniform all the time, we have state of the art, high-performance aircraft in the air nearby all day long. We hear the SOUND OF FREEDOM when an F-22 or F-35 streaks over the house... and we read in the local paper, sometimes daily, but at least weekly, of the loss of one of our own in combat in the Middle East.

And that is what brings me to the reason for this email.

Staff Sergeant Mark DeAlencar was 37 years old, had a family and was a Green Beret with the 7th Army Special Forces stationed here in the Fort Walton area. He was killed on April 8, 2018, while fighting the Islamic State in eastern Afghanistan. In January of this year, he was deployed for the second time to Afghanistan. He promised his adopted daughter, Octavia, that he would be home for her High School Graduation. He didn't make it. But she went to graduation anyway. And in the audience were eighty (80) US 7th Armed Special Forces soldiers from her dad's unit in full Parade Dress Uniform. Additionally, they brought THEIR FAMILIES to be with them, as well.

And as Octavia ascended the steps to the stage to receive her diploma THEY ALL SILENTLY STOOD UP. And when she was presented her diploma they ALL CHEERED, CLAPPED, WHISTLED... and YES, CRIED. Everyone in attendance then stood up and cried and cheered. Octavia had graduated and yes, she had lost her Dad... but she had 80 other DADS to stand there with her and take his place. I just wanted to share this moment with you... and remind you that THIS IS WHAT IT'S LIKE TO LIVE IN A MILITARY TOWN. This is the real America we all love... and I'm proud to be part of it. May God bless our men in uniform and their families who give so much.

Note: This touches my heart as this is what this great country is all about. I am this week on the JBER military base in Anchorage so this brings tears to my eyes as I am surrounded by this warmth each day. Since my daughter in law and granddaughter were in the automobile accident, they have had dinners, flowers, pickup and delivery services and anything else they have needed delivered to their home every single day. This comes from the youngest single airmen to the Generals and their families. They have all given the support my family needs and we are so very grateful and thankful for their love and attention. When asking the military gate guard my quick question of "How are you today?", he responded "Living the dream, ma'am".
