Edgewood Children's Ranch 4 Way Test

In 1966 Juvenile Court Judge D. Arthur Yergey saw a need for a residential facility for young boys who had exhibited negative social behavior due to family circumstances. This led Judge Yergey to John W. "Jack" Lynd, who subsequently opened Edgewood Boys Ranch in Orlando, FL. Through prayer and loving care, boys were given a safe environment in which to change the direction their life was headed. In 1968, a generous donation of 110 acres was given by "Aunt" Minnie Rouse to be the permanent site for the Ranch. In following years, the Ranch added girls to its program and is now called the Edgewood Children's Ranch. Through this residential program for boys and girls ages 6-17, the Ranch today is able to accommodate more than 70 students at a time. Yet the methods and goals are the same as in 1966-love and prayer, bringing about changed hearts and lives.





Dorothy Mae Taylor passed away peacefully at her home in Windermere, Florida on Friday, February 15, 2019. She is preceded in death by her parents, Mary Ethel and Benjamin Hagler of Erin, Tennessee and her husband, Albert Isaac Taylor in 1968. She is survived by her daughter and son-in-law, Norma and Byron Sutton of Windermere, Florida. She was blessed with a beautiful family that includes her grandsons; US Air Force Colonel Harlie Bodine, his wife Lianna and their four children, Daniel, Hendrikje, Anneke and Annalise, currently stationed in Anchorage, Alaska; and Taylor Bodine and his wife, Cindy McCree and their two sons, Matthew and Luke of Winter Garden; and step grandson Eric Sutton and his wife Elizabeth Dukes and their two sons Elliot and Garret of Columbia, Tennessee. She is preceded in death by her sisters, Lila McElroy, Ann Williams and Betty Gooch. Surviving are her oldest sister,



Evelyn Alsobrooks and her only brother, Benjamin Franklin Hagler, both of Erin, Tennessee. She has fifteen surviving nieces and nephews.

Dorothy was born in Erin, Tennessee on July 18, 1924. She attended and graduated from Erin High School. She married Albert Taylor in Detroit, Michigan in November, 1945. They returned to Tennessee in 1955 where Albert started a steel scaffolding manufacturing company. Their claim to fame was providing all the scaffold for the construction of the Superdome in New Orleans. Albert died of a massive heart attack in 1968. Dorothy remained in Erin but spent the winters in Windermere until 2014 when she stayed year around.

Dorothy was always involved in her church and her community as well as the lives of her family. She is best described as a wonderful cook – making incredible carrot cakes, chocolate pies, yeast rolls and strawberry jellies. But she also is known for her talents in sewing. She embroidered cloths and kneeling pads for both the Erin Methodist Church and St. Luke's Methodist Church. She made hundreds of afghan baby blankets and over a hundred Velcro pajamas for "Sew Much Comfort", the organization providing adaptive clothing for wounded warriors injured in the military. She participated in Sarah's Circle, the United Methodist Women. She was an Eastern Star member and was approved as a "Daughter of the American Revolution". She participated in the Rotary Club of Windermere events, providing carrot cakes and other goodies for their fund raisers and socials. She helped provide food for the homeless and supported her family in all their endeavors. As a beloved Sister, Aunt, Mother, Grandmother and Great Grandmother, and friend, she will be missed greatly.
