



Mark Daniel Maloney

President 2019-20 Rotary Club of Decatur Alabama, USA

Mark Daniel Maloney is a principal in the law firm of Blackburn, Maloney, and Schuppert LLC, with a focus on taxation, estate planning, and agricultural law. He represents large farming operations in the Southeastern and Midwestern United States, and has chaired the American Bar Association's Committee on Agriculture in

the section of taxation. He is a member of the American Bar Association, Alabama State Bar Association, and the Alabama Law Institute.

He has been active in Decatur's religious community, chairing his church's finance council and a local Catholic school board. He has also served as president of the Community Foundation of Greater Decatur, chair of Morgan County Meals on Wheels, and director of the United Way of Morgan County and the Decatur-Morgan County Chamber of Commerce.

A Rotarian since 1980, Maloney has served as an RI director; Foundation trustee and vice chair; and aide to 2003-04 RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe. He also has participated in the Council on Legislation as chair, vice chair, parliamentarian, and trainer. He was an adviser to the 2004 Osaka Convention Committee and chaired the 2014 Sydney Convention Committee.

Prior to serving as a district governor, Maloney led a Group Study Exchange to Nigeria.

He also served as Future Vision Committee vice chair; regional Rotary Foundation coordinator; Foundation training institute moderator; Foundation permanent fund national adviser; member of the Peace Centers Committee; and adviser to the Foundation's Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools Target Challenge Committee.

District Governor Cindi Cioci



Our new District Governor is from the Apopka Club and has been a Rotarian since 2006.

The first district governor from the Rotary Club of Apopka in its 92 vears of existence, Cindi Cioci was selected for the office in October 2016. As a member of the Rotary Club of Apopka for 12 years, Cioci has been actively involved since joining the club. She became the club secretary in her first year, and became secretary of the club's biggest fundraiser, the Apopka Fair, and continues in that capacity. Cioci served as club president in 2010-2011. She has been named Rotarian of the Year for the club and received the Service Above Self Award. Cioci is a Paul Harris+4 and member of the Paul Harris Society. Following her year as president, she became an assistant governor for three years; District Membership chair in 2015-2016; District RLI registrar in 2016-2017. Cioci was selected assistant governor of the Year for 2012. Being district governor, Cioci will lead the 49 Rotary clubs in the district. When she visits all the clubs and speaks to the Rotarians, Cioci will tell the members what her goals are for her year. Mark Maloney, Rotary International president for 2019-2020, has tasked the governors to bring his message to each and every Rotarian in the world. Cioci said her goal is growing the Apopka Rotary Club by attracting younger and more diverse members; involving family members so club members don't have to choose between Rotary and family; making the path to leadership viable; and enhancing relations with the UN for sustainable development in its 75th year. Cioci took office on July 1.
