

Day 2 We left the dock around 7:30am, went down the creek to get fuel at the Landing's Marina, then it was the Chesapeake Bay until we pulled into Solomon Island Yacht Club. Tomorrow, we are planning to leave around 6:30am and sailing down to Fishing Bay Yacht Club. Below is a picture of the channel to Solomon Yacht club. It was a good day, no problems or issues!!



Day 3 Today was another day of motoring down the Chesapeake Bay. It was a cold and cloudy day. Tomorrow will be stopping at Fort Meade. After, this stop, we will be in the ICW for the rest of the way. We might jump out into the ocean at some point depending upon the weather. Here is a picture from the archives.

Day 4 We are up and on the water before daybreak again. Here is a picture of the Sunrise(Cloud rise) as we were leaving the channel and heading towards the bay. We actually hosted two of the sails today. The jib and the stay-sail. The wind was from behind us, so we were running. Only one person, pointed out that I listed the wrong Fort in my last email. We are at Fort Monroe. Arrived around 1ish and spent the day wandering around the Fort. Very interesting place. Tomorrow, we are heading down the ICW. This is going to be interesting. We need to avoid hitting the top of the mast on the bridges, the keel from hitting the bottom and the hull from the other boats!!



Day 5 Shoved off the dock at 6:30am and watch the sunrise over the Naval Shipyard. Made it through all the bridges and a lock with out any problems. We did not hit the bottom yet, I am sure we will sometime. We are spending the night at Coinjock Marina where they have a 32oz steak. I did not get it, I only got the Mate's steak which was around 20oz. It was good. Tomorrow, will be a long day. The next Marina is about 80 miles away.



Day 6 We motored sailed across a big bay today. It was a bumpy ride, there was a head wind of about 15mph, a couple of good gusts every now and then. Then spent a lot of time in the "Ditch". I had forgotten how pretty the fall can be up north. All the trees still have there fall colors. The sunset was amazing tonight. Tomorrow, we are heading to Beaufort. They are forecasting rain in the afternoon, might just be a soggy day tomorrow. So, I am sending two pictures today. I might be looking in the archives tomorrow for a nice picture.

Day 7 Today was only a gray, cold, windy day with the rain only being a light mist. Nothing exciting happened along the way. Saw a bunch of interesting houses, but that was about all. Crossed a couple of big bays that were a little bit choppy. All the bad storms are coming in later tonight and tomorrow until noon. So, I decided to stay port in Troy is coming down for a visit which brighten up my day. We are at Beaufort Dockage right on the City's water front. All sorts i nautical shops, museums and other interesting things to do here. Here is a picture of the waterfront and the vessel at the marina.
