

## **OUR ROTARY FAMILY**

**DAY !4** Uncle Tom arrived and we provisioned the vessel will all sorts of good healthy food. After the vessel was squared away. I gave Uncle Tom a couple of reading assignments. I am very glad that he is a fast reader. There will be a test in the morning, so he maybe up all night studying. There will also be pop quizzes along the way!!!

We are going to wait for low tide when the tide is slack before we move the boat to the fuel dock at 7:30am. There is a very strong current in the Marina and they do not really allow sailboat movements when the tide is not slack. We will then head down the channel which has been reported to be very shallow. Should be an interesting day.



**DAY 15** Today, started with a beautiful sunrise and ended with a beautiful sunset. In-between, was interesting. Today, was definitely a "Pucker Factor" day. We went through some low area during almost low tide and watched the depth meter read 7 to 8 feet for long periods of time and we draw 5 feet. One spot, we went through an area at almost high tide and had 6 feet showing. We did not hit the bottom, but we thought any minute that we get stuck. Someone, above was looking after us today. We are once again, anchored in the ICW for the evening right off of Cumber Island. We cooked Bison burgers and had a nice salad for dinner.

We went by the huge container that was have a bad day, week, year? Yes, it is laying over on it's side with 4,200 new cars in it. BEWARE of cheap cars for sale on the internet!



**DAY 16** Everyday is always different. Never the same thing twice. Today, we left our anchorage which was right on very south point of Cumberland Island and just inside of the channel leading to the Ocean. Left at our usual 6:30am and cruised into the Sunrise as we headed out into the ocean. The ocean was great, winds 10-15 knots with 1-2 seas. Saw lots of dolphins. Entered into St. John's River/Jacksonville inlet(Fort George Inlet) and went by all of the Navy ships.



We should be somewhere around Jacksonville tomorrow, maybe St. Augustine.





My Uncle was able to get in touch with of one of his very dear friend that he has known for 50 years that lives just south of Jacksonville. We were able to get a slip at the Palm Cover Marina and arrived around noon. His friend and his friend's brother and wife came over and spent the day visiting on the boat. We had a wonderful time. After they left, I snuck a nap in for about an hour, and then my Uncle treated me to a very nice Mexican meal with dessert(flan).

My Uncle is on the far right, with the Jeep tee-shirt. Hmmmm...I would how he got that tee-shirt!!



Tomorrow, we are on the final leg. We might just make it to the home dock around 6ish, or me might anchor out and come in the next day around noon. It all depend on the weather, tides, etc.

**DAY 17** We made it Daytona Beach, the Halifax Marina with out any problems or issues. I would like to thank my crew; Mike Kelley, Steve Amburgey and Uncle Tom. We did not get stuck on the Bottom, hit any Bridges or Boats and avoided Bad weather. It was an absolutely wonderful experience cruising down the ICW. I witness all sort of sights and made new friendships and got to learn more about my friends who responded back to my emails with their stories. Yes, I would do it all over again. I am going to perform some upgrades on the vessel and then set off again, somewhere. Any suggestions?

During the trip, I am glad that I did not have to use my emergency gear that I got for the crew. We were blessed in some many different ways, that I can not count them all.
