

Party with a Purpose On or Around 29th February 2020





From Louis Acosta:

I hope this message finds you well. I know I haven't been the most active Rotarian this year and there are no excuses but I want to let you know that I think about you guys often and hope to make it out to some meetings.

I wanted to share something with you and ask for your prayers. On November 21 I took my younger son Marcus in to get some blood work done as a part of a physical and the next day we got some bad news. I had to pull him out of school and take him immediately to the emergency room because the doctor said he was in renal failure. He was asymptomatic and it caught everybody by complete shock the only reason I took me to get blood work is because he had been complaining of cramps for a few weeks and we attribute that to being dehydrated low potassium and not really working out. Come to find out that unfortunately he has had a chronic kidney issue unbeknownst to us and was diagnosed with end stage renal failure. Needless to say our hearts are broken but we made it through some of the tough times over the past 3 weeks and he has gotten stronger. He was ported for dialysis both Hemo and peritoneal and he's coming back stronger and doing Dialysis. He is regaining his strength and all of his bloodwork is starting to come back better and "normal" for him. He has been put on a kidney transplant list with six different hospital systems in Florida and we have an appointment with the mayo clinic in Jacksonville on January 10.

Please pass this along to other Rotarians and *I simply ask for their prayers for Marcus* that he continues recovery and find a kidney in the near future. Thank you Norma and God bless you and may you have a merry Christmas.



Disney Legend Bob Matheison, a key figure in Walt Disney World's history, from the development process to serving as Director of Operations for the Magic Kingdom at its 1971 opening to Executive Vice President of Parks for the resort in 1987, has passed away at the age of 85.



When you look back to Walt Disney World's grand opening on October 1, 1971, many people think of Walt's older brother Roy, who led the charge to finish construction of the Magic Kingdom and read the commencement speech. But most people may not know the name Bob Matheison, and they should.

Bob Matheison was one of the first Directors of Operations at <u>Walt Disney World</u>. Beginning in 1960 as a sound coordinator at Disneyland, Bob moved up the ranks to become Director of Operations at Disneyland in 1969. In those 9 years, he most notably became director of operations for <u>it's a small world</u> and was a supervisor for the technical assistance staff working on Magic Skyway, Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln, and the <u>Carousel of Progress</u> for the New York World's Fair. Afterward, Bob worked with Walt to create a 13-week executive training program for what was going to be Walt Disney World; the forerunner to the current training program.

Bob was moved over to the Florida Project, where he personally outlined the operations for the Magic Kingdom. In 1972, he was promoted to Vice President of Operations. In 1984, he was named Vice President of the Magic Kingdom and <u>EPCOT</u>. By 1987, he found himself Vice President of Parks, Walt Disney World. Bob Matheison retired after 34 years with The Walt Disney Company in February 1994.

If you visited Walt Disney World in its first 20 years, you saw Bob's work. He never considered any work he did to be "legendary." Instead, he praised his fellow employees.

He said: "I got to work with people that believed in loyalty, camaraderie and sticking it out through good days and bad days. No one person could do everything by himself or herself. It was a team effort."

Bob was named a Disney Legend in 1996.

Do you know the reason Walt Disney World opened in October? Bob Matheison explained that it was all about crowd control. They did not want a repeat of Disneyland's opening in 1955.


He explained, "We didn't want to open to a big crowd, so we opened after school started. The day after Thanksgiving, however, we backed traffic up almost to Orlando."

Walt Disney World will celebrate its 50th Anniversary on October 1, 2021. There is no doubt he will be looking on with Walt and Roy and all the greats who have already passed and helped bring the Most Magical Place on Earth to life.


