

Chief David A. Ogden has been a successful law enforcement executive with over 34 years in policing and a BA degree in criminal justice. As a former Director of the Central Florida Intelligence Exchange and a Captain for the Sheriff's Office Intelligence Unit he was responsible for domestic homeland security, intelligence sharing and collaboration for local, state, federal and private sector partnerships. Chief Ogden also commanded the west side Sector III Patrol Section with a proven crime reduction utilizing the Intelligence Led Policing model for success. He served in other notable areas of policing: High Risk Incident Commander, Training Division, Traffic/Motors/DUI Divisions, Undercover Narcotics, Tactical Operations and 14 years on the SWAT team. Chief Ogden is a strong believer in the team concept and the importance of good leadership.

Dave Ogden is married with four children. His family is the founder of a local charity in honor of one of his children who lost a battle from a rare neurological disease. The Ogden family is active with local charities such as, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, the West Orange Dream Center, and Ironmen of God men's ministries to help make a positive impact in our community.


