Therefore, it is unlikely to serve as direct ancestor of SARS-CoV-2. As of now, only relatively small numbers of bat coronavirus sequences have been characterized. Viral sequences from a large number of wild bats and other animals are urgently needed to identify the immediate hosts of SARS-CoV-2. It is possible that there are other not yet identified hosts infected with coronaviruses that can jump to human populations.”

NEWS

- Between March 1 and August 1, 2020, 1,336, 561 deaths occurred in the US, a 20% increase over expected deaths based on death data from the National Center for Health Statistics (Figure).
 - 150,541 (67%) of excess deaths were attributed to COVID-19.
- The annual percentage change in deaths due to heart disease and Alzheimer disease/dementia were statistically significant for multiple weeks of the analysis frame.

Compared with other countries, the US experienced high COVID-19-associated mortality and excess all-cause mortality into September 2020 (Figure).

- The US had lower COVID-19 mortality rates than other high mortality countries in early Spring, but higher mortality rates after May 10, 2020.
- As of September 2020, the United States had similar COVID-19 mortality rates (60.3 per 100,000) as other high mortality countries (36.2–86.8 per 100,000).

We have several important updates this month within Youth Services to share with you. Details follow in the body of this message, but to summarize:

We are not having RYLA this fiscal year. We are working to conduct a one day program for our youth focused upon **Leadership**, Zone 33-34's proposed Signature Project, “ **Rotary+Youth+Peace in Action (RYP): Engaging 100,000 Young Community Peacebuilders** ” and **Mental Health Initiatives**.

Battle vs. polio continues

Saturday, Oct. 24, was World Polio Day around the world. There is no cure for this water-borne virus that infects children ages 5 and younger. The virus is passed by human contact through asymptomatic people, but vaccines prevent the disease.

Gov. Ron DeSantis issued a proclamation acknowledging Rotary Clubs' efforts since 1985 to eradicate this crippling disease. Rotary members and their global partners have spent over \$3 billion in this effort. The disease is a distant memory for many Americans, and this hemisphere was declared polio-free in 1994.

In August, Africa was declared free of the virus. But in two countries — Afghanistan and Pakistan — it remains endemic. With renewed dedication, we hope to announce to the world in the next five years that another disease is under control. For more information, please see End Polio Now online.
