

2 - THE OFFICIAL ROTARY FLAG

An official flag was formally adopted by Rotary International at the 1929 Convention in Dallas, Texas. The Rotary flag consists of a white field with the official wheel emblem emblazoned in gold in the center of the field The four depressed spaces on the rim of the Rotary wheel are colored royal blue. The words "Rotary" and "International' printed at the top and bottom depressions on the wheel rim are also gold. The shaft in the hub and the key way of the wheel are white.

The first official Rotary flag reportedly was flown in Kansas City Missouri, in January 1915. In 1922 a small Rotary flag was carried over the South Pole by Admiral Richard Byrd, a member of the Winchester, Virginia Rotary Club. Four years later, the admiral carried a Rotary flag in his expedition to the North Pole. Some Rotary clubs use the official Rotary flag as a banner at club meetings. In these instances it is appropriate to print the words "Rotary Club" above the wheel symbol, and the name of the city, state or nation below the emblem. The Rotary flag is always prominently displayed at the World Headquarters as well

as at all conventions and official events of Rotary International.

The Story of Our Podium

Have you noticed the Rotary podium we have been using for our meetings?

Last April I realized that the old one had seen better days, so I took it upon myself to "retire" it and build us a new one.

I found a great mill in Oveido and went there looking for some lumber to use. The owner/operator is second generation, learning the business from his father. I wanted wood that was distinctive and relatively light-weight and he showed me some cypress. It looked like just the thing and then he mentioned that he got the log in Windermere. Deal sealed!

To make the story of the podium even better, I had some heart pine that I had salvaged from the old Cal Palmer home, so I used that as the trim. I wanted to make the podium as light-weight as possible, so I cut the sides a little thinner than I normally would have and used a boatbuilding technique of fiberglass and epoxy resin to reinforce the joints. I think that turned out pretty well, as they seem very sturdy. Notice the wood- grain matching on the front of the podium. I like joining book-matched boards to line up the knots, it usually results in some kind of "face", eyes, nose and mouth. Can you find it?

So now we have a nice podium, made from historic wood from Windermere and the Rotary roundel that I think may be original from when our club started.
