Dr Ted Higgins is a well-established general and vascular surgeon in Kansas City who after nearly 40 years of international mission work, built a surgical center in rural Haiti in 2016.

It has developed into the only surgical and trauma center in the region, as well as a surgical training site for Haitian chief surgical residents as they perform roughly 70 operations monthly. A clinic area, serving 1600 medical, pediatric, maternity, HIV, and dental patients monthly, has developed in a recently constructed medical pavilion on the campus. The entire operation is performed and managed by Haitians.

Dr Higgins recently joined his surgical team in Haiti and traveled to the earthquake region where they utilized a functional hospital to perform surgery on earthquake victims.

Dr Higgins is the brother of Margaret Cox, wife of Rotarian Dale Cox.



Researchers also are trying to develop combination shots that would be used to fight COVID, the flu, and other viruses, The Times said.

Americans have long shown hesitancy about the flu vaccines, but the COVID pandemic apparently caused more people to get flu shots.

In 2019-2020, 48.4% of U.S. adults got the flu vaccine, the <u>U.S. Centers for Disease</u> <u>Control and Prevention</u> reported. That was a 3.1 percentage point increase from the previous year.

## Who is eligible for a booster shot?

The F.D.A. authorized <u>booster shots</u> for a select group of people who received their second doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine at least six months ago. That group includes: Pfizer recipients who are 65 or older or who live in long-term care facilities; adults who are at high risk of severe Covid-19 because of an underlying medical condition; health care workers and others whose jobs put them at risk. People with <u>weakened immune systems</u> are eligible for a third dose of either Pfizer or Moderna four weeks after the second shot.

# Will people who received Moderna or Johnson & Johnson vaccines be eligible?

Regulators have not authorized booster shots for recipients of the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines yet, but an <u>F.D.A. panel is scheduled to meet</u> to weigh booster shots for adult recipients of the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines.





#### 17 - VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Vocational Service is the "Second Avenue of Service." No aspect of Rotary is more closely related to each member than a personal commitment to represent one's vocation or occupation to fellow Rotarians and to exemplify the characteristics of high ethical standards and the dignity of work. Programs of vocational service are those which seek to improve business relations while improving the quality of trades, industry, commerce and the professions. Rotarians understand that each person makes a valuable contribution to a better society through daily activities in a business or profession.

Vocational Service is frequently demonstrated by offering young people career guidance, occupational information and assistance in making vocational choices. Some clubs sponsor high school career conferences. Many recognize the dignity of employment by honoring exemplary service of individuals working in their communities. The 4 -Way Test and other ethical and laudable business philosophies are often promoted among young people entering the world of work. Vocational talks and discussion of business issues are also typical vocational service programs at most clubs.

Regardless of the ways that Vocational Service is expressed, it is the banner by which Rotarians "recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations" and demonstrate a commitment to "high ethical standards in all businesses and professions." That's why the Second Avenue of Service is fundamental to every Rotary club.
