

- A growing body of evidence has shown that these vaccines are safe and effective.
- COVID-19 vaccines were developed using scientific methods that have been around for decades.

The FDA gave the Pfizer BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine emergency authorization to use in children ages 5 years through 15 years and full approval to use in people ages 16 years and older. 25 - THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE

Most Rotarians have never attended a Rotary district conference. They have not experienced one of the most enjoyable and rewarding privileges of Rotary membership.

A district conference is for all club members and their spouses, not just for club officers and committee members. The purpose of a district conference is for fellowship, good fun, inspirational speakers and discussion of matters which make one's Rotary membership more meaningful. Every person who attends a district conference finds that being a Rotarian becomes even more rewarding because of the new experiences, insights and acquaintances developed at the conference. Those who attend a conference enjoy going back, year after year. Every one of Rotary's more than 500 districts has a conference annually. These meetings are considered so important that the Rotary International president selects a knowledgeable Rotarian as his personal representative to attend and address each conference. The program always includes several outstanding entertainment features, interesting discussions and inspirational programs.

One of the unexpected benefits of attending a district conference is the opportunity to become better acquainted with members of one's own club in an informal setting. Lasting friendships grow from the fellowship hours at the district conference.



DEACON BOB PLEUS 1936 - 2021

Bob was born January 9, 1936 in Orlando. His parents were the late Judge Robert J. Pleus, Sr. and Virginia Sleeper Pleus. He has been married to his beloved wife Marie Terry" for 58 years and has 6 children, 11 grandchildren and 6 Great grandchildren. He attended St. James School, Orlando High School, and graduated from St. Thomas Military academy in St. Paul, Minnesota. He obtained a bachelor's degree cum laude from The University of Notre Dame in 1957. Upon graduation from Notre Dame, he was commissioned an ensign in the Navy and served on active duty until his entry into the University of Florida College of Law. He graduated in 1962 and returned to his home in Orlando where he began the practice of law with his father's former firm, then known then as Rush Reed and Marshall. He later was a partner in Smathers, Tepper and Pleus; Carlton Fields; Pleus Adams and Spears, and was of council to Akerman Senterfitt. For 5 years he was general council to the Diocese of Orlando serving five bishops. In 2000 Judge Pleus was appointed by governor bush to the fifth district court of appeal where he served as chief judge before his retirement. Following his retirement, Judge Pleus served as a senior judge. In 2000, he was ordained a deacon and served as a permenent deacon at Holy Family Catholic Church. His leadership in civic activities included serving as President of the Windermere Rotary Club, President of Tiger Bay Club of Orlando, President of the University club of Orlando, President of the Committee 101, President of the Orange County Historical Society, President of the Notre Dame Club of Greater Orlando, President of the Sierra Club, Past Grand Knight of Council 5150, and District Deputy as well as a fourth degree Knight of Columbus. In the political arena Bob served two years on the Windermere Town Council and for six years as Mayor of Windermere. He also was President of the Tri County League of Cities. Bob was active in bar activities as well, having served as President of the Orange County bar and for eight years on the Florida bar's Board of Governors.


