Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Gratitude for Our Police – Flashing lights in front of our house Saturday night reminded me to be grateful for our outstanding Windermere police force, as I watched them intercept a car and make an arrest. I am further, and painfully, reminded by the flowers placed by the sidewalk in front of

Walgreens on Conroy Road.

The police force in our sleepy little town has a dedicated and professional staff keeping the peace and serving the community. They're busy. In February, in addition to routine town business and service, they worked 3 crashes, supported 5 community events, and made: 21 arrests 256 traffic stops 77 traffic citations 104 warning citations 123 calls for service 75 back-up / assists 323 business checks 65 house checks 18 assists to the public 180 school foot patrols.

Their Lives Are Truly on the Line - Chief Ogden and his staff continuously deal with stressful and harrowing situations and put themselves in harm's way. We became so painfully aware of this reality exactly eight years ago, on March 22, 2014. This was when Windermere Officer Robert "Robbie" German was shot and killed in the line of duty. The flowers in front of Walgreens on Conroy Road are in remembrance of that tragedy and loss.

These folks deserve our utmost respect, gratitude, and admiration. There are 26 of them including part-time and reserve. It's good to get to know them and to show our appreciation. https://town.windermere.fl.us/police-department/



Brooke Evans tested positive for <u>Covid-19</u> in January while living in a congregate building that houses many people in Madison, Wisconsin, where she advocates on housing issues and for those without housing. She is certain the Pfizer vaccines and booster shot she received last year — and were provided to her despite being uninsured — helped save her life. But the effects of the coronavirus still linger, and she's fearful it may be a sign of long <u>Covid</u>.

"Unfortunately, I was one of those Americans for whom it has taken weeks and weeks to recover," Evans, 30, said. "I still do not feel like myself." If she were to contract Covid again and need treatment or seek to get a second booster shot when it's available, she expects those to come at a cost she can't afford. That's because the White House has warned that starting Tuesday, it will phase out a Covid program that reimburses doctors and medical providers the cost of testing, treating and vaccinating the uninsured.

The arrangement is set to end in early April — the result of a <u>lack of federal government funding</u> after Democrats and Republicans in Congress were unable to agree on an additional \$22.5 billion in budget allocation that the White House had requested for Covid relief.

The dark horse vaccine company Novavax <u>announced strong results</u> today from a pivotal, 30,000-person trial of its pandemic coronavirus vaccine in the United States and Mexico. The vaccine uses a protein of SARS-CoV-2, a different technology from the COVID-19 vaccines authorized so far, and delivered 90.4% overall efficacy against symptomatic COVID-19 infections, and 100% protection against moderate and severe disease. Against eight viral variants of interest and concern, its efficacy was 93.2%. And the vaccine appeared safe and well-tolerated.

36 - INTERACT

Interact, the Rotary youth program, was launched by the RI Board of Directors in 1962. The first Interact club was established by the Rotary Club of Melbourne, Florida. Interact clubs provide opportunities for boys and girls of secondary school age to work together in a world fellowship of service and international understanding. The term, Interact, is derived from "inter" for international, and "act" for action. Every Interact club must be sponsored and supervised by a Rotary club and must plan annual projects of service to its school, community and in the world.

Today there are over 7,200 Interact clubs with more than 155,000 members in 88 countries. "Interactors" develop skills in leadership and attain practical experience in conducting service projects, thereby learning the satisfaction that comes from serving others. A major goal of Interact is to provide opportunities for young people to create greater understanding and goodwill with youth throughout the world.
