MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Your board of officers and directors met on March 16, enjoyed Diane's delightful salad and soup (feel free to call for recipes), sipped a few, but not too many, and made the following plans and decisions:

1. **TopGolf** - Planning a family fun TopGolf event (not a fundraiser this time) in the near future. Date and details to come.
2. **President-elect** - Nominated Karen Hairston for her second term as our club president. And Karen graciously accepted! (The general membership confirmed her at our Tuesday March 22 meeting.)
3. **Club Computer** - Approved purchase of a new laptop computer to support AV and Zoom for our Tuesday meetings.
4. **Rotary Means Business** - Targeted Monday evening May 23 for our next Rotary Means Business meeting. (Our last one was a big success.)
5. **Budgets** - Reviewed budgets, expenditures, and commitments for Club Operations and Club Service.
6. **4-Way Test Essays** - Confirmed our goal to find sponsors for the 4-Way Test Essay programs at Edgewood Ranch and the two Elementary schools.
7. **Scholarships** - Allocated \$6000 for college scholarship awards at Olympia and West Orange High Schools, taking advantage of partial coverage by return of funds from Rotary District.
8. **Boggy Creek** - Approved a \$1000 donation to the Camp Boggy Creek, which provides special tailored camp experiences for kids with a range of health issues. <https://www.boggycreek.org>
9. **Enabling Girls** - Scheduled our support to the Girl Scouts through buy of \$500 worth of cookies and donation of the cookies to the Fisher House, which supports families of veterans under medical care.
10. **Edgewood Picnic** - Targeted May 21 and approved \$1000 for our annual Edgewood Ranch picnic.
11. **Mystery Trip** - Targeted early April for a Mystery Trip. (since scheduled for April 3, getting sign-ups.)
12. **District Assembly** - President-elect Jim Schuppert reminded us that the District Assembly will be held on April 30, 2022 from 8am to 2pm. (RSVP on DACdb to attend in-person or via Zoom.)
13. **Highlights of Committee Chair reports** (here's a brief sample):
 - a. Membership – At the Windermere Fine Art Show on February 26 and 27, we received 17 expressions of interest in joining our club. (Since then 5 potential candidates have attended our meetings and/or submitted applications or continued to show strong interest.)
 - b. Public Image – Our presence on Facebook, Instagram, and Nextdoor continues to grow.
 - c. Youth Services - The 4 Way test at Edgewood was a great success and the Thornebrooke and Windermere elementary schools are scheduled for **April 19 and May 17th** respectively. We will meet at 7am at those schools on those dates.

What about you? Volunteer and share your talents and ideas. You are unique, so if we don't have a Board position that fits your particular talent, we'll make one up.

We can all do a little more. A few of the things we committed to in our Strategic Plan:

- Add 5 members each year – We can do it. 'Each One Bring One' will get'er done.

- Increase our exposure to the public – Big progress on Social media, Art Show booth – and the inflatable sign.

“We have all moved on the mental health spectrum during the pandemic.” Dr. Shekhar Saxena
The pandemic has made matters worse: it has affected not just those infected with COVID-19 but also everyone else, as many “life factors” changed as a result of our response to control its spread, like working from home and social-distancing. “Many of these changes may work for us in a short time frame, but some of the new realities may have a negative societal impact from a long term point of view,” Saxena said. Mental health has to be seen as a dimension, or a spectrum, rather than as a binary that cleanly divides people who are well and people who are not. When he was studying psychiatry, Saxena said, they were told there were people who have a mental disorder – just like physical diseases – and people who are okay. But over the years, Saxena said he realised we are all on a spectrum with excellent mental health at one end and very bad mental health at the other, and that we *move* from one end to another in time. There is no fixed state as such.

Latest News (US News)

Communities with high vaccination rates are expected to have an extra line of defense against the coronavirus. As of March 23, around 77% of people in the U.S. had received their first shot to guard against COVID-19 and 65% were considered fully vaccinated, according to [USAFacts](#) and [data](#) from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Nearly 30% of the population has received a booster dose, and all states have now fully vaccinated at least 50% of their population.

Meanwhile, the average daily number of COVID-19 cases over seven days in the U.S. decreased by roughly 8% in the last week, from around 30,000 on March 15 to about 27,500 as of March 22, according to [data](#) from the CDC.

After the success of Interact clubs for high school-age youth in the early 1960s, the RI board created Rotaract in 1968. The new organization was designed to promote responsible citizenship and leadership potential in clubs of young men and women, aged 18 to 30. The first Rotaract club was chartered by the Charlotte North Rotary Club in Charlotte, North Carolina. In 1994 there were more than 149,000 members in more than 6,500 Rotaract clubs in 107 countries.

Rotaract clubs emphasize the importance of individual responsibility as the basis of personal success and community involvement. Each club sponsors an annual project to promote high ethical standards in one's business and professional life. Rotaract also provides opportunities leading to greater international understanding and goodwill. Rotaractors enjoy many social activities as well as programs to improve their community. A Rotaract club can exist only when continuously sponsored, guided and counseled by a Rotary club. The programs of Rotaract are built around the motto "Fellowship Through Service."
