

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Rotary's FOUR-WAY TEST. Where did it come from? Why does it mean so much to us?

A Rotarian, Herbert J. Taylor, created it for his own use in 1932 after he took charge of a company facing bankruptcy. Rotary adopted it in 1943 and translated it into over a hundred languages. It has been published in thousands of ways. The Four-Way Test is part of what we are.

Mr. Taylor's company struggled financially and needed something to distinguish itself from its competitors. He wanted it to be the character, dependability, and service mindedness of their personnel. He wanted to hire better people and to find ways to help them become better men and women

He didn't want to dictate a set of ethical standards. He wanted a simple ethics measuring stick that everyone could quickly memorize and consistently apply. He wanted everyone to question whether their plans, policies, statements, and actions were right or wrong, and then to do right.

He initially applied the test just to his own actions and relationships and was amazed how often, and how far, he himself strayed from the truth. He further found a plethora of untruths in company literature, letters and advertising. He was humiliated and at times discouraged by what he saw.

After faithful personal effort to live up to the Four-Way Test, Mr. Taylor asked his staff to consider whether anything in the Test was contrary to their ethics or religious beliefs. All agreed that truth, justice, friendliness and helpfulness aligned with their religious ideals, and if constantly applied in business should result in greater success and progress. They agreed to apply the Four-Way Test to all their dealings in the company. Later, they asked all employees to memorize and consistently apply the Four-Way Test.

Diligent use of the Four-Way Test spurred changes in his company's advertising and policies and relations with employees, customers, suppliers, and competitors. It fostered good will, friendship, and trust, and the business recovered and flourished. They found that the intangible dividends from use of the Four-Way Test were even greater than the financial ones. It improved their own moral character and that of their personnel. Consistently applying the Four-Way Test to all their working relations helped make it a habit at home and in their social and community lives. They became better parents, friends, and citizens.

Mr. Taylor credited the very survival of the company to their consistent use of the Four-Way Test. We Rotarians keep it at the forefront "*Of the things we think, say, or do*". And that's the truth.

This Tuesday, April 19, starting at 7am, we meet at Thornebrook Elementary School, served a Continental breakfast and listen to the fifth-grade winners of our annual Four-Way Test essay contest tell how the Test helped them. <u>All members and guests are invited</u>. Please attend, you'll be glad you did.

 First COVID breath test authorized by FDA. The agency has granted an <u>emergency use authorization</u> for the first COVID-19 test that can detect the coronavirus in a breath sample, within about three minutes. The InspectIR COVID-19 Breathalyzer can evaluate 160 samples per day with a high degree of accuracy and is about the size of a piece of carry-on luggage. It can be used in doctor's offices, hospitals and mobile testing sites by a trained operator under the supervision of a health care provider. "Today's authorization is yet another example of the rapid innovation occurring with diagnostic tests for COVID-19," Jeff Shuren, M.D., director of the FDA's Center for Devices and Radiological Health, said in a statement. A positive test should be confirmed with a molecular test, such as a PCR, according to the FDA. The company making the breathalyzers expects to produce about 100 machines per week.

Apr. 15, 2022 -- COVID-19 vaccines and boosters provide protection against hospitalization after contracting the coronavirus again, according to a <u>new CDC</u> <u>study</u>. Although a previous infection may provide some immunity, it may wane over time and not keep patients out of the hospital, the researchers found.

"People had good immunity from (the original strain of the virus) after getting COVID the first time, but after going through the Delta period and now the Omicron period, we wanted to see what the public health impact would be," Jackie Gerhart, MD, one of the study authors and vice president of clinical informatics at Epic Research, <u>told USA Today</u>.

As the pandemic continues, more Americans are likely to become reinfected with the coronavirus, USA Today reported. As a result, public health experts are urging people to maintain up-to-date vaccinations and boosters to reduce the risk of hospitalization.

"If you've been previously infected with COVID, you can get improved immunity through a vaccine and booster," Gerhart said. "We have the tools that can help decrease your likelihood of getting reinfected and hospitalized."

40 - AMBASSADORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships Program is the world's largest privately funded international scholarships program. In 1947, 18 "Rotary Fellows" from 11 countries were selected to serve as ambassadors of goodwill while studying in another country for one academic year. Since that time, approximately \$242 million has been expended on some 25,000 scholarships for people from more than 125 countries, studying in 105 countries around the world. The purpose of the Scholarships Program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries. Scholars are expected to be outstanding ambassadors of goodwill to the people of the host country through both informal and formal appearances before Rotary and non-Rotary groups.

Beginning with the 1994-95 program year, The Rotary Foundation offers two new types of scholarships in addition to the Academic-Year Ambassadorial Scholarship offered since 1947. The Multi-Year Ambassadorial Scholarship is awarded for two or three years of specific degree-oriented study abroad. The Cultural Ambassadorial Scholarship provides three or six months of funding for intensive language study and cultural immersion in a language other than their native language.

Rotarians know that Rotary Foundation scholarships are very worthwhile investments in the future and one important step in seeking greater understanding and goodwill in the world.
