MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Who are we? What backgrounds, experiences, and shared passions do our members have?

The makeup of the club has changed over its 53 years, from all-male, all-white, mostly business owners and high-level executives to a much more diverse, younger, more interesting, and I think stronger group. We have: 39 active and 5 honorary members,

- 5 recently inducted members and several prospective members expected to join soon,
- 10 women, 4 couples, 18 retirees, 1 recent college grad, 1 corporate member, 2 students,
- 25 members who attend meetings regularly and are consistently active,
- 14 members who rarely attend meetings, but participate and contribute in other ways,
- Business owners, CPAs, developers, engineers, an architect and artist, a federal judge, lawyers, pilots, a medical doctor, career military, real estate agents, hospitality industry executives, insurance and investment advisors, teachers, operator of a charitable foundation, authors...,
- Members on three Town of Windermere volunteer committees and other influential community boards,
- Constitution, Board of Officers & Directors, Bylaws, Policies & Procedures, 5-year strategic plan,
- Strong support, leadership, and training from our district organization,
- Charitable 501(c)(3) corporation and tax status, formed in 2012,
- Health Central sponsorship of our charitable activities,
- Satellite club initiative at Health Central in Ocoee,
- Lastly, we're all immigrants, or descendants of immigrants. As Lily Storm says in her amazing book, <u>An Immigrant Story</u>. "...every proud American who arrived here after the 1700s is an immigrant themselves as their ancestors first came to North America in the name of "freedom".

Many of our members have made Rotary a lifetime commitment. Occasionally new members leave because our club does not meet their expectations or they find that it doesn't fit their schedule or budget. Recently, we have mostly lost members to health issues, death, or moving away.

The value of showing up, getting to know each other - "Development of Acquaintance" is the first Object of Rotary. This is the heartbeat of any successful Rotary club. The second Object is High ethical standards in business, the value of different occupations, and the use of each Rotarian's professional skills in giving back. The third Object is Incorporating service into each aspect of a Rotarian's life – personal, business, and community. The fourth Object is Increased cultural understanding and peace around the world through a unified goal of community service. It all starts with getting together and getting to know and appreciate each other.

On a personal side, I have only good words for my hip replacement surgeon and his team. Dr. Dean Cole specializes in hip and knee replacement surgery and has invented many prosthetic implant devices that are used widely. One of his assistants said that Dr. Cole designed a special implant for a woman who had a unique shoulder anatomy. Since that design would never be used again, he gave her the model normally used as a template to create more copies. I opted for outpatient surgery and came home soon as I could walk with a walker and meet a few other requirements. Diane is taking good care of me.



In December 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) granted emergency use authorization (EUA) for the first two oral antivirals for the treatment of certain COVID-19 patients. These treatments mark a step forward in the fight against the pandemic, due to their ability to be taken at home, which can reduce the burden on both patients and the health care system. Additional treatments are also under investigation by several other biopharmaceutical companies. More than two years after the initial discovery of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19, scientists continue to develop ways to fight back. The newly authorized antivirals represent an additional tool we have to address the pandemic and help reduce the burden on hospitals and the health care system. 50 Things You Should Know About Rotary


44 - POLIOPLUS

PolioPlus is Rotary's massive effort to eradicate poliomyelitis from the world by the year 2005. It is part of a global effort to protect the children from five other deadly diseases as well as the "plus" in PolioPlus. The program was launched in 1985 with fund-raising as a primary focus. The original goal was to raise \$120 million. By 1988, Rotarians of the world had raised more than \$219 million in cash and pledges. By 1994, the cash total exceeded \$246 million! These gifts have enabled The Rotary Foundation to make grants to provide a five-year supply of vaccine for any developing country requesting it to protect its children. Grants have been made to nearly 100 countries-a commitment, thus far, of \$181 million to buy vaccine and to improve vaccine quality.

Achieving eradication will be difficult (only one other disease, smallpox, has ever been eradicated) and expensive (estimated cost to the international community is nearly \$2 billion). It will require continuing immunization of children worldwide, and it also must include systematic reporting of all suspected cases, community-wide vaccination to contain outbreaks of the disease, and establishment of laboratory networks. Rotary will not be alone in all these efforts but in partnership with national governments, the World and Pan American Health Organizations, UNICEF and others. Rotary's "people power" gives us a special "hands on" role. Rotarians in developing countries have given thousands of hours and countless in-kind gifts to help eradication happen in their countries.

No other non-governmental organization ever has made a commitment of the scale of PolioPlus. Truly it may be considered the greatest humanitarian service the world has ever seen. Every Rotarian can share the pride of that achievement!
