MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

It's good to have a plan. Our club's 5-year Strategic Plan came together in early 2021 through a 5-month concerted effort by five of our members. Our five **Major Goals** and essence of our plan are as follows:

1. Better serve the community – grow, do more, be more visible, let others help.

Below are the five Objectives we set in that area, action steps for each, and *examples of our progress/status*. (Green = progress, yellow = opportunity).

Objective #1: Improve participation in & knowledge of RLI and all District activities & resources

- Encourage all officers and directors to attend annual district assembly and all 4 RLI sessions: *Jim Schuppert attended the District Assembly, District Conference, Awards Ceremony and BBO on May 21. Let's ask Jim to tell us all about it and decide whether we want to go next time.*
- Ask district leaders to speak at club meetings: *District Governor Barry Gainer spoke to us about District Goals, George Stuart about membership, and Greg Gorsky about diversity and inclusion. Let's plan more in the new Rotary year.*
- Include District events schedule in the Roundabout: *If you look you'll see them. As always, the Roundabout is your go-to place for club and District news and event scheduling.*
- Provide DACdb etc. training and use Rotary websites during meetings: *Gregg Anderson and Chuck Barcus ran training sessions for our members and will probably do it again if we ask.*

Objective #2: Improve involvement and knowledge of other clubs

- Attend neighboring clubs at least once a year, report to the club, consider teaming: *A few of us have attended other local club meetings. Let do more.*
- Ask neighboring clubs to provide guest speakers: *We had a few. let's do more.*
- Arrange joint social events or happy hours with Dr. Phillips, Winter Garden : *We had a combined event planned with the Dr. Phillips club but had to cancel because of Covid and health issues. Let's try again.*
- Host a Business-to-Business meetings: *We hosted one and it was a big success. Let's do it again.*

Objective #3: Increase awareness and participation in fellowship clubs

- Research and report to the club at least once a year: *Anybody want to volunteer to lead this?*
- Provide programs and paths to participation: *Ditto, this should be a fun project. Kayaking anyone?*

Objective #4: Strengthen member knowledge of each other and their vocations

- All new members conduct Classification Talks: *I think we're right on track here, and WOW! what fascinating talks they were!*
- Provide questionnaire to members on breakfast options, meeting time, satellite club: *We did it, we are enjoying the sandwiches from Paloma Coffee shop, and fruit, yogurt, and coffee provided by members.*
- Establish and maintain data base of member bios as a resource for new members: *Don Hairston set this up but got few useful responses. This club has some of the most fascinating people on the planet. Please tell us about yourself and what you have accomplished.*

Objective #5: Improve understanding and support of Foundation

- Report on the Foundation's 7 Areas of Focus in our newsletter and/ or meetings at least once a year: *Looking for a volunteer to take this on.*

A virus that shows no signs of disappearing, variants that are adept at dodging the body's defenses, and waves of infections two, maybe three times a year — this may be the future of Covid-19, some scientists now fear.

The central problem is that the coronavirus has become more adept at reinfecting people. Already, those infected with the first Omicron variant are reporting second infections with the newer versions of the variant — BA.2 or BA.2.12.1 in the United States, or BA.4 and BA.5 in South Africa. Those people may go on to have third or fourth infections, even within this year, researchers said in interviews. And some small fraction may have symptoms that persist for months or years, a condition known as long Covid.

“It seems likely to me that that's going to sort of be a long-term pattern,” said Juliet Pulliam, an epidemiologist at Stellenbosch University in South Africa.

“The virus is going to keep evolving,” she added. “And there are probably going to be a lot of people getting many, many reinfections throughout their lives.”

It’s difficult to quantify how frequently people are reinfected, in part because many infections are now going unreported. Dr. Pulliam and her colleagues have collected enough data in South Africa to say that the rate [is higher with Omicron than seen with previous variants](#).

Latest News (Science)

Two studies based on phase 3 clinical trials published yesterday in the *New England Journal of Medicine* show promising results for two novel COVID-19 vaccine platforms—a plant-based coronavirus-like particle vaccine, and a receptor-binding domain (RBD)–dimer-based vaccine.

And neither vaccine requires extreme cold chain storage, which makes them appealing candidates for low- and middle-income countries, a key component of global COVID-19 vaccination efforts.

The first vaccine is a plant-based particle vaccine, developed by Medicago/GSK, and was tested on participants in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, and the United States from Mar 15 to Sep 2, 2021. [The vaccine, CoVLP](#), was administered in two shots 21 days apart, and results were compared to placebo. The study continued until at least 160 COVID-19 cases were detected in participants at least 7 days following the second dose of vaccine.

The second vaccine, [ZF2001](#), was tested at 31 clinic sites in Uzbekistan, Indonesia, Pakistan, and Ecuador, and later in China. The vaccine is made by Anhui Zhifei Longcom of China. Participants were randomized to receive placebo or three injections of vaccine administered 30 days apart. The trial took place from Dec 12, 2020, to Dec 15, 2021.

Neither trial assessed how well the vaccines performed against asymptomatic infections, and both had very few participants over the age of 60. But in [an editorial](#), Hanna Nohynek, MD, PhD, and Annelies Wilder-Smith, MD, PhD, write that the results seen in these trials are encouraging.

45 - ROTARY PEACE PROGRAMS

A special program of The Rotary Foundation was originally labeled the "Rotary Peace Forum". The concept of a center or educational program to promote greater understanding and peace in the world was originally discussed in 1982 by the New Horizons Committee and the World Understanding and Peace Committee. In 1984 it was further explored by a New Programs Committee of The Rotary Foundation.

The essence of the Rotary Peace Program is to utilize the non-governmental but worldwide resources of Rotary to develop educational programs around the issues that cause conflict among nations in the world as well as those influences and activities which promote peace, development and goodwill. The program includes seminars, publications or conferences as a means to initiate a global dialogue to find new approaches to peace and world understanding. Specific Rotary Peace Programs are selected annually by the trustees of The Rotary Foundation. Many peace programs are held in conjunction with presidential conferences.

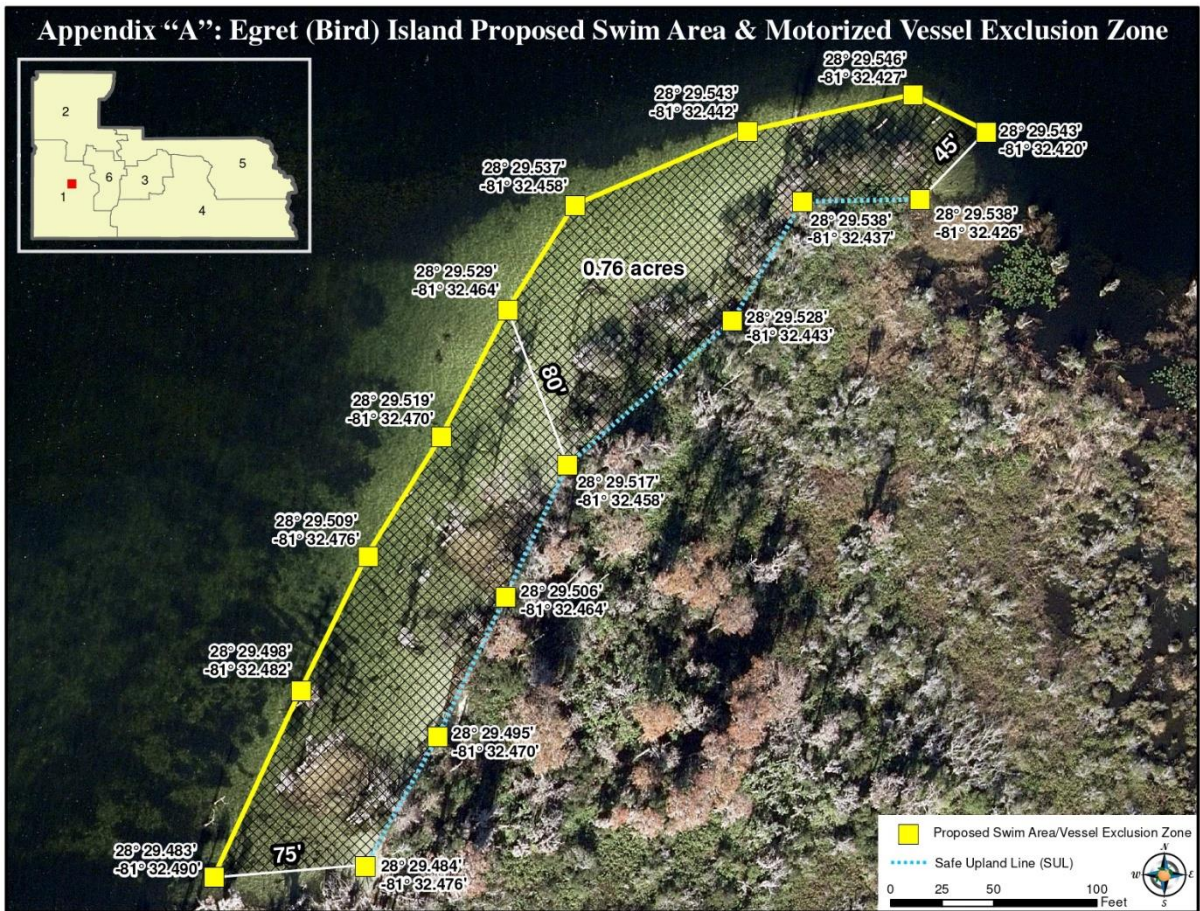
