MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Greetings Windermere Rotary Family,

As promised last week, here is the second of five installments on how our club is doing relative to our 5-year Strategic Plan completed in early 2021. Again, our five **Major Goals** are:

1. Better serve the community – grow, do more, be more visible, let others help.

- 2. Expand our reach, beyond the Town of Windermere.
- 3. Get the word out. Show the community what we do, how we serve, and how they can help.
- 4. Appreciate our members, sponsors, speakers, supporters, neighbors and show it.
- 5. Learn, share, and take advantage of the knowledge, resources, and culture of service that are Rotary (discussed last week).

This week we'll see how we're doing on the Objectives and Action Steps of Major Goal #1 $\frac{Green = progress}{Progress}$, $\frac{Yellow = opportunity}{Yellow}$:

Objective #1: Add 5 new members per year via structured and focused recruiting. We have been blessed with 7 outstanding new members since July 1, 2021. Plus, one former member and past president returned. Our newest member and the 8th this year, Candy Cole, will be inducted at our May 31st meeting.

- Reach out to new residents, former members, hospitality industry, young adults, businesses. *Membership Chairman Andy Agoos formed and manages a focused outreach and follow-up committee, with a lead for each of eight focus areas, now including veterans, Town of Windermere employees and businesses, 'Nextdoor' and other social media.*

- Involve every member in recruiting. Actually, I prefer "sharing" to "recruiting". "Each one, bring one" is probably not 100%, but is getting results. The more we each get involved and the more we know about Rotary, the easier and more natural this gets. Simply showing up also makes a statement in favor of recruiting.

- Recruit and engage community officials. Town of Windermere officials appreciate Rotary, but some are concerned that membership in Rotary could complicate their position on certain topics while they are in office. As relationships and trust builds, I think this will go away.

Have 3 or more fundraisers each year – raise at least \$15,000 per year

- Perform signature events every year – Topgolf raised \$13,570 this Rotary year in a largely outdoor experience to accommodate social distancing. We deferred our signature Lobster event, and are planning for this Fall. We are searching for a third fundraiser and Lily Storm has provided an idea for us to consider.

- Establish and follow consistent guidance for events. Several of our repeat events now have detailed plans with timelines, contacts, lessons learned, etc.

- Partner with other charitable organizations. We are looking forward to partnering with Lily Storm's LadyStorm Foundation on an event targeted for 2023.

Improve our presence & visibility within the community

- Engage: Civic leadership, local business support, Chamber of Commerce. Member participation on three Town volunteer committees and several workshops, and partnering on projects like the Memorial Day Observance gives us opportunities to engage with and develop trust of our civic leaders. Several Windermere businesses now display our Four-Way Test plaques. Re-joining and participating in the West Orange Chamber of Commerce at some point is one of our objectives.

- Promote: Logo displays, attire, library section, Gazette, TOW recognition. We've had several articles in the Windermere Gazette, the Observer, and the Southwest Bulletin. Regi Cidral posts info on our meetings and events on Facebook and Instagram and the circulation is expanding rapidly. We can do better at wearing our Rotary attire and pins.

- Recognize and honor: TOW staff and departments, veterans, community leaders. We honored the Public Works staff in one of our Tuesday meetings and teamed with the Town of Windermere for the upcoming Memorial Day observance. We have instituted annual events for Veteran's Day and Memorial Day.

Increase our corporate sponsorship

- Develop a target list, build and nourish relationships. Don Hairston has assembled a corporate package handout, but to date we have not signed up any new corporate members. We can use some help.

Stand by for progress reports on Major Goals 2, 3, and 4.



First, there was Delta. Then Omicron. Now, it's the Omicron subvariant BA.2.12.1. And, public health officials are keeping a close watch on the BA.4 and BA.5 subvariants. These waves of cases, caused by infections with new variants, have characterized the COVID-19 pandemic. But how can public health officials know which variants are likely to cause large numbers of cases and which will not take hold in the population?

Now, scientists have developed a machine learning model, called PyR₀ that analyzed millions of SARS-CoV-2 genomes. In doing so, it can predict which viral variants will likely dominate and cause surges in COVID-19 cases. It can also help researchers identify which parts of the viral genome will be less likely to mutate, uncovering good targets for vaccines that will work against future variants.

HOW DO VACCINES WORK?

Vaccines work by teaching your immune system to recognize certain viruses. After you receive a vaccine, your body will be more prepared to fight back. Vaccines help prevent or reduce the severity of the illness if you are exposed to the virus that causes the disease.

The science behind many types of vaccines has existed for decades. Many different techniques are used to make vaccines, and they each work in specific ways.

Instead of using the whole virus, subunit vaccines use just small pieces of a virus. These pieces can't give you the disease. They can be the protein, sugar, or casing around the virus. This kind of vaccine teaches your body how to recognize the actual virus and attack it when needed.

Scientists created the first subunit vaccine in the 1980s to help prevent hepatitis B. This technology has been used for many other vaccines as well, including shingles and human papillomavirus (HPV).

50 Things You Should Know About Rotary


46 - PAUL HARRIS FELLOWS

Undoubtedly the most important step to promote voluntary giving to The Rotary Foundation occurred in 1957, when the idea of Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed. Although the concept of making \$1,000 gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s it began to gain popularity. The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin and attractive certificate have become highly respected symbols of a substantial financial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world. The companion to the Paul Harris Fellow is the Paul Harris Sustaining Member, which is the recognition presented to an individual who has given, or in whose honor a gift is made, a contribution of \$100, with the stated intention of making additional contributions until \$1,000 is reached. At that time the Paul Harris Sustaining Member becomes a Paul Harris Fellow. By 1994, more than 450,000 Paul Harris Fellows and 160,000 Sustaining Members have been added to the rolls of The Rotary Foundation.

A special recognition pin is given to Paul Harris Fellows who make additional gifts of \$1,000 to the Foundation. The distinctive gold pin includes a blue stone to represent each \$1,000 contribution up to a total of \$5,000 in additional gifts.

Paul Harris recognition provides a very important incentive for the continuing support needed to underwrite the many programs of The Rotary Foundation which build goodwill and understanding in the world.
