MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Greetings Windermere Rotary Family,

This is the fourth of five installments on how our club is doing relative to our 5-year Strategic Plan. This week, we cover Major Goal #3 and its five Objectives and the Action Items under each.

Major Goal #3: Get the word out. Show the community what we do, how we serve, how they can help.

Green = progress, Yellow = opportunity)

Objective #1: Increase our exposure to the public via news and social media

- Improve and maintain website, FB links, Nextdoor App, TOW website, other social media, email campaigns. As of May 18, we had 987 followers on FB and 38 on Instagram. Regi Cidral posts at least weekly and followers are increasing. Regi sent welcome messages to 68 new people on the "Nextdoor" App since last July. Town of Windermere (TOW) Admin posts our meetings and events on the TOW website and FB. Andy Agoos maintains a weekly email to visitors and prospective members with a copy of the Roundabout and updated meeting information. A major update to the club website is still planned.
- Include announcements and events in the Observer, the Gazette, SW Bulletin, others. We had Rotary articles published in two issues of the Windermere Gazette and one issue of the SW Bulletin. We have continuing opportunities to publish articles and news with the Observer, SW Bulletin, and Gazette.
- Expand content and distribution of the Roundabout. *The Roundabout reaches over 70 people each week and is chock full of information on our members, club, district, and international news and events.*
- Tell the Rotary history establish section in the library or new administration building. Norma Sutton has maintained a wealth of club history in paper and digital form, including news articles and back issues of the Roundabout. We hope to find a suitable place where it can be stored and accessed by Rotarians and the public.

Objective #2: Repeat Veterans Day-like experience with at least 2 patriotic events per year

- Memorial Day, Veterans Day, 4th of July, D-Day, etc. Our Veterans Day and Memorial Day events were well attended. The Memorial Day event was well supported by the Town of Windermere Admin, WPD, Public Works, West Orange HS ROTC and the Navy Sea cadets. The 4th of July Pancake Breakfast is a potential future teaming opportunity with the TOW.

Objective #3: Increase service projects (vs fundraising projects)

- Edgewood, Christian Homeless Center, 2nd Harvest, hospitalized children/elderly provide useful items. *Our activities in this area continue to be limited by Covid restrictions and concerns.*
- Pavilion get final approval, begin fundraising, announce to community, make 'thermometer' sign. This project is approved and underway, funded by a \$1M grant from Healthy West Orange.
- New ideas solicit members, do something different each year. New members bring new ideas, connections, and resources. Lily Storm, one of our newest members, is working on a proposal for a new fundraiser as a combined effort with the charitable foundation that she leads. Our very newest member, Candy Cole, also leads a charitable foundation. Two months ago, our club did a "mystery trip" with over 30 attendees.

Objective #4: Recognize Sponsors' Contributions — show our appreciation in every media and at every event. We recognize our major sponsor Orlando Health consistently in the Roundabout and are being more consistent in recognizing Orlando Health as they continue to sponsor our charitable events and in our postings on Facebook and Instagram. We should take advantage of all opportunities in this regard, as Orlando Health has been a long-term supporter of our club and several of our members have played major roles in the development and management of Orlando Health.

Objective #5: Promote the 4-Way Test and recruit sponsors

- Provide stickers to Interact students, 5th graders, businesses. Three downtown Windermere businesses now display our 4-Way Test plaque in their facilities. Promoting the 4-Way Test and sponsorship of our essay contests are some of our long-term objectives.
 - Include more elementary schools in the program. We aim to add a 4th elementary school.
- Solicit financial sponsors for the program. Norma Sutton developed a sponsorship format that we can use to acquaint orthodontists and others with the 4-Way Test essay contest and provide a path to participate. So far our outreach to potential sponsors has not been successful, but we're just getting started.



LATEST NEWS (CNN)

The Biden administration is expected to announce Friday that the <u>US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> will lift its requirement for travelers to test negative for Covid-19 before entering the US, according to a senior administration official and a US Centers For Disease Control and Prevention official.

The move, which CNN was first to report, will go into effect for US-bound air travelers at midnight on Sunday, the officials said. The CDC is lifting the restriction that the travel industry had lobbied against for months after determining it was no longer necessary "based on the science and data," the senior administration official said. The CDC has the ability to reassess the order at any time and potentially reinstate it, especially if a new variant develops and poses concern. The measure has been in place since January 2021.

That official said the Biden administration plans to work with airlines to ensure a smooth transition with the change, but it will likely be a welcome move for most in the industry.

Testing international arrivals doesn't make much sense to Dr. William Schaffner, an infectious diseases specialist at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, Tennessee. "I've been bemused about that for a long time because we've got plenty of Covid here! It's not as though we're trying to keep Covid out," Schaffner told CNN in March. "It's here already."




50 Things You Should Know About Rotary

48 - About Community Service

A community, defined in its simplest terms, is a group of people who have something in common. But in real life, it is something far more complex than that. Each member — every individual, group, organization, and business — draws benefits from the community in many different ways. For a community to thrive, each of its members must honor a commitment to contribute to the well-being of the whole by returning those benefits in kind.

Rotarians recognize the importance of giving back to the community. After all, Community Service is one of the Four Avenues of Service. Every Rotary club and every Rotarian assumes a responsibility to find ways to improve the quality of life for those in their communities and to serve the public interest. When those efforts are effective, they not only contribute to the greater good, they also promote Rotary's positive image. What makes a community service effort effective? Relevance. A community service project must address a real, current community concern or issue. Rotary clubs should start by surveying their communities to find out where help is needed. Once a club has listened to its community, it can begin to envision effective responses to problems.
