Q & A About Rotary in the Ukraine

At Rotary, we are deeply concerned by the escalating loss of life and humanitarian hardship caused by the war in Ukraine. We're using our deep networks and decades of experience to take swift action in the region.

Rotary was the first humanitarian organization to get permission to use the rail hub for relief supplies, Kočiová says, and clubs have sent trains full of medical supplies, nonperishable food, and hygiene products across the border. The Slovak government and the European Union have since designated the hub as a primary pathway for sending supplies by rail into Ukraine. Supplies that arrive in Košice are unloaded and sorted by Rotary volunteers into warehouses before being moved into Ukraine. The Rotary and Rotaract clubs have also used more than 60 trucks and buses to carry 740 tons of supplies into the western Ukrainian region of Uzhhorod.

This is the fifth and final installment on how our club did during the first year of our 5-year Strategic Plan. This week, we cover Major Goal #4: **Enhance Participant Engagement and its Objectives and Action Items.** *Green = progress, Yellow = opportunity*

Objective #1: Increase membership involvement from 40% to 60% Focus on committee and event participation - invite every member to serve on a committee. *This was a banner year for committee activities and member participation. Nearly every member participated in some significant way, either as part of a committee or individually. Here's a sample:*

Eight members joined Andy's Membership committee, each covering a segment of the community: 1. new residents, 2. the hospitality industry, 3. young adults, 4. Town of Windermere employees & businesses, 5. former members, 6. Nextdoor.com subscribers, 7. veterans, and 8. corporations.

RYLA, the 4-Way Test essays, and scholarships all got done and done well under Norma's small Youth Services committee. It's long overdue for us to expand this committee and share the load.

The Administrative committee put together our club's first-ever 5-year Strategic Plan and updated the club bylaws and Policies and Procedures.

Regi's Public Image committee achieved wide circulation of our activities on FaceBook, Instagram, and Nextdoor.com and through the Roundabout. Members are learning to share and broaden the coverage.

Karen's Club Service committee organized the Holiday party and the Induction dinner, and provided for breakfast at our Tuesday meetings.

Emerson's International Services committee provided support to needy children in Brazil through partnership with his former club, the Rotary Club of Nova Andradina. Dale Cox organized support for much-needed medical services through the Higgins Brothers Surgery Center in Haiti.

Byron's Foundation committee promoted "Every Rotarian Every Year" giving and obtained District Designated Funds (DDF) to support our youth programs.

Don Hairston's Vocational Service actions included preparation of a Corporate Member registration package, continued planning for the Health Central satellite club, and start of a book of member bios.

Calvin Wimbish was keynote speaker at our Memorial Day Observance. Dan Fanelli organized a kayaking adventure. Francisco Cidral organized bike rides and a guided tour of the Lake Apopka conservation area and museum. Chuck Barcus bought an 8-ft inflatable Rotary sign and set it up for Tuesday meetings. Craig Lee set up Tuesday meeting breakfasts and managed the 50/50. Gregg Anderson and Chuck Barcus provided training in use of the Rotary websites.

Less visible, but significant, are contributions of time and/or resources by members who we don't see often. As fundraiser silent auction items, Sterling Hall offered his property in the islands and Louis Acosta provided vacation packages. Brad Busbin provided legal services for the pavilion project.

Sign-up sheets for everything – This is a good tool, let's strive to be more consistent with it.

Objective #2: Increase Interact involvement – solicit ideas, provide more volunteer opportunities

• Brainstorm, develop a plan that Interact can follow throughout the year. *We will be working with a new Interact sponsor at Olympia and seeking a new sponsor at West Orange. As resources, 3 of our members, Fiorella and Diego Grieco and Spencer Saintfleur came to us as highly successful Interact members.*

• Develop a community-oriented committee to strengthen the club. *This will take more planning.*

Objective #3: Celebrate members' contributions and participation – recognize or honor one member during each meeting. *We started this, let's do it more consistently.*

Objective #4: Increase corporate sponsorship & business participation.

• Post Rotary emblem in every business in town. *Our 4-Way Test plaque is displayed at Tim's Wine, The Body Coach, and Paloma Coffee Shop so far, let's pursue more businesses in downtown Windermere.*

• Ask businesses if we can include them on our website as supporters of Rotary. *Let's first develop concepts of what their postings would look like on our website.*

• Solicit donations to the service fund from businesses. *Let's first define where their money will go.*

Survey corporate websites for potential sponsors. *Let's first define the value of sponsorship.*

According to the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#), some people who contract COVID-19 can have detectable virus for up to three months, but that doesn't mean they are contagious. When it comes to testing, however, the PCR tests are more likely to continue picking up the virus following infection. "PCR test can stay positive for a long time," Chicago Department of Public Health Commissioner Dr. Allison Arwady said in March.

"Those PCR tests are very sensitive," she added. "They keep picking up dead virus in your nose for sometimes for weeks, but you can't grow that virus in the lab. You can't spread it but it can be positive."

The CDC notes that tests "are best used early in the course of illness to diagnose COVID-19 and are not authorized by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration to evaluate duration of infectiousness."
