MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Greetings Windermere Rotary Family

It is my pleasure to serve as your 2021-2022 President.

Greetings Windermere Rotary Family,

Here is the third of five installments on how our club is doing relative to our 5-year Strategic Plan put together in early 2021. Again, our five **Major Goals** are:

- **1. Better serve the community** grow, do more, be more visible, let others help. (*covered*)
- 2. Expand our reach beyond the Town of Windermere.
- 3. Get the word out. Show the community what we do, how we serve, and how they can help.
- 4. Appreciate our members, sponsors, speakers, supporters, neighbors and show it.
- 5. Learn, share, and take advantage of the knowledge, resources, and culture of service that are Rotary (covered previously).

This week we'll see how we're doing on the Objectives and Action Steps of Major Goal #2, Expand our reach beyond the Town of Windermere. <u>Green = progress</u>, <u>Yellow = opportunity</u>):

Objective #1: Recruit 2 members from neighboring developments per year via focus on HOAs.

- Use Keene's Point as model. Two existing club members reside in Keene's Point. This gives us contacts and insight into ways to promote Rotary there. Our first goal is to place an article on Rotary in the Keene's Point magazine.
- Expand to Isleworth, Belmere, others. A resident in a Gotha development and parent of a 4-Way Test essay winner has expressed strong interest in joining Rotary.

Objective #2: Develop the Satellite Club at Health Central. This is on hold pending decisions by new upper management at Health Central.

- Update business plan, coordinate, and restart meetings. Don Hairston has updated the Satellite Club business plan and Norma Sutton has maintained contact with Health Central management. Don will restart meetings at Health Central when we get the ok from their management.

Objective #3: Recruit 2 new Windermere area residents per year via mail and social media.

- Use greater Windermere area database and Nextdoor.com App. Regi Cidral's Instagram postings get wide circulation and brought us two active young members with extensive backgrounds in Interact as they grew up in Venezuela. Although it has not been productive so far, we are continuing our outreach by US Mail to new area residents.

Objective #4: Recruit 1 Interact parent per year.

- Reach out: get contact info, provide Roundabout, flyers, letters, invitations. We expect that Interact members will be the best path to inform their parents about Rotary and we will provide them with information to pass on to their parents.
- Engage: ask parents to volunteer in fundraising events. We seek opportunities to team with the Interact clubs. Our fundraising events have been limited by restrictions and concerns associated with Covid19.
- Recognize: host Interact recognition night with parents included. While we have not engaged substantially with Interact parents, we provided club T-shirts for the Olympia and West Orange HS Interact clubs. Both clubs received a Zone 34 citation based on their performance and our support. We provided a Rotary banner for display at the Olympia football games.

Objective #5: Consider getting involved with a Rotaract club – contact current clubs for info, ideas. We have not found an existing Rotaract club to work with in our area. To compensate, we expanded our club's Policy and Procedures to include young residents who would seek membership in a Rotaract club if one were available. As a result, two dynamic students, with extensive prior participation in their Interact club in Venezuela have become active and productive members of our club.

Objective #6: Consider sponsoring student exchange.

- Assess and promote interest from Interact members and our Rotary members. We can participate directly in student exchange by hosting exchange students in our homes or by providing funding. A club survey is planned to gage members' level of interest

Objective #7: Promote Corporate Membership – form membership subcommittee and generate plans. Don Hairston leads the Corporate Membership subcommittee and has created a Corporate Membership Package for presentation to candidates. As yet we have not received any new corporate membership applications.



May 29: Can I stop isolating if I'm still testing positive for the virus? (New York Times)

For most people infected with the Omicron variant of the coronavirus, viral levels peak less than five days after infection. But some continue to test positive for the virus for 10, 12, or even 14 days. However, it's not clear if continuing to test positive means you're still infectious. Said <u>Yonatan Grad</u>, Melvin J. and Geraldine L. Glimcher Associate Professor of Immunology and Infectious Diseases, "Some people may not be infectious at the end of their course even if still antigen-positive, whereas others may be infectious even if antigen-negative."

Correlation between vaccine coverage and the COVID-19 pandemic throughout the world: Based on real-world data

Based on the results of our temporal and spatial analysis of the correlation between the COVID-19 vaccine coverage rates and outcomes of the COVID-19 epidemic, we provide additional evidence that a mass COVID-19 vaccination policy would protect the health and wellbeing of all, especially when the rate of COVID-19 vaccine coverage passes 60% and the benefits to preventing severe disease and preventing transmission of infection are likely to become obvious.

47 - SPECIAL ROTARY OBSERVANCES


In the annual Rotary calendar several months are designated to emphasize major programs of Rotary International. January is Rotary Awareness Month. This is a time to expand knowledge of Rotary and its activities among our membership and throughout the community. February is designated as World Understanding Month. This month was chosen because it includes the birthday of Rotary International, February 23. During the month, Rotary clubs are urged to present programs which promote international understanding and goodwill, as well as launch World Community Service projects in other parts of the world.

World Rotaract Week is the week in which **March** 13 falls. It's a time when Rotary clubs and districts highlight Rotaract by joining in projects with their Rotaract clubs.

April is set aside as Rotary's Magazine Month. Throughout the month, clubs arrange programs and activities which promote the reading and use of THE ROTARIAN magazine and the official regional magazines of Rotary. **August** is Membership and Extension Month, a time to focus on Rotary's continuing need for growth, to seek new members and form new clubs. **September** is Youth Activities Month. Rotary clubs of the world give special emphasis to the many Rotary-sponsored programs which serve children and young people. During this month many clubs give increased attention to youth exchange activities.

October is Vocational Service Month. During this period, clubs highlight the importance of the business and professional life of each Rotarian. Special activities promote the vocational avenue of service. November is selected to be Rotary Foundation Month. Clubs and districts call attention to the programs of The Rotary Foundation and frequently cultivate additional financial support for the Foundation by promoting contributions for Paul Harris Fellows and Sustaining Members. Each of these special months serves to elevate the awareness among Rotarians of some of the excellent programs of service which occur within the world of Rotary.
