A new subvariant of Omicron is making headlines around the world, with health agencies and virologists believing it could likely become the dominant strain in the ongoing coronavirus pandemic. BA.2.75 is already becoming dominant in India, after it was first detected there in May.The subvariant has now been found in dozens of countries including the UK, Germany, and the Netherlands. Because it is overtaking the previously dominant strain in India - BA.5 - virologists think it is likely to be more transmissible and therefore likely to become dominant elsewhere. But they caution that they don't yet have enough data on the strain to make definitive statements like this. The Dutch Institute for Public Health announced this week that BA.2.75 had been identified in the Netherlands, saying little is known about it, although "it appears to be able to more easily bypass the defence built against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus through small, specific changes".

This raises fears that it could potentially be adept at evading immunity built up through vaccination or previous COVID-19 infection.

More ericans are catching the coronavirus for the second, third or even fourth time. And each time someone contracts COVID-19, they are rolling the dice on whether they will come down with serious health issues. It's a reinfection loop that is seizing the country with no immediate end in sight, and it is driven by a coronavirus variant scene that continues to quickly change. The majority of ericans have had COVID-19 at some point in time, according to <u>estimates</u> from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. But with more than 120,000 new infections reported on average each day – a number that is sure to be a <u>significant undercount</u> as many rely on at-home tests – the pool of ericans who haven't gotten COVID-19 is getting smaller while the number of ericans who are getting reinfected grows.

Of course, COVID-19 reinfection wouldn't be a major issue if it did not come with additional health risks. But that isn't the case. Ziyad Al-Aly, a clinical epidemiologist at Washington University in St. Louis, says he decided to study reinfections after more of his patients started reporting getting COVID-19 again, and he wondered if getting reinfected adds any adverse health risks.

"The answer is absolutely, absolutely yes," says Al-Aly, who is also the chief of research and development at the Veterans Affairs St. Louis Health Care System. "People need to really be aware that if they've previously been infected, it's still worth it to protect themselves from or to reduce the risk of getting reinfected."

In a recent <u>study</u>, which hasn't been peer reviewed yet, Al-Aly and other researchers found that people who had been reinfected had a greater chance of death, hospitalization, lung and heart problems, diabetes, fatigue, digestive and kidney disorders and mental health issues within six months of their last infection than those who had been infected once.
