

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention <u>on Thursday loosened many of its</u> recommendations for battling the coronavirus, a strategic shift that puts more of the onus on individuals, rather than on schools, businesses and other institutions, to limit viral spread.

No longer do schools and other institutions need to screen apparently healthy students and employees as a matter of course. The CDC is putting less emphasis on social distancing — and the new guidance has dropped the "six foot" standard. The quarantine rule for unvaccinated people is gone. The agency's focus now is on highly vulnerable populations and how to protect them — not on the vast majority of people who at this point have some immunity against the virus and are unlikely to become severely ill. The new recommendations signal that the Biden administration and its medical advisers have decided that the lower fatality rate from covid-19 in a heavily vaccinated population permits a less demanding set of guidelines.

Aug. 8, 2022 – BioNTech expects to begin deliveries of two Omicron-adapted vaccines as soon as October.

The German biotech firm, which makes the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine, announced the update Monday as it reaffirmed its vaccine revenue forecast for the year, according to The Associated Press.

BioNTech is expanding its COVID-19 product pipeline to aim for "prolonged and broad protection", Ugur Sahin, MD, the company's CEO and co-founder, said during the earnings call.

BioNTech and Pfizer have delivered 3.6 billion doses of the COVID-19 vaccine to 180 countries and territories. About 1.5 billion doses have gone to low- and middle-income countries.

Demand is decreasing in Western countries, where many people have received two to four shots by now, the AP reported.

But booster campaigns with updated shots that target Omicron variants are expected to increase demand this fall. Pending regulatory approval, both adapted vaccines will be available in time for fall booster campaigns, BioNTech said.
