Mounting evidence suggests that millions of Americans have gotten COVID without knowing it because they had no symptoms or mild cases. Some people have avoided it altogether, perhaps because of genetic or immune system traits. Both types of cases are important to public health, according to experts. "It's definitely true that some people have had COVID and don't realize it," said <u>Stephen Kissler</u>, research fellow in the <u>Department of Immunology and</u> <u>Infectious Diseases</u>. "It is potentially good news if there's more immunity in the population than we realize." He added that knowing a person's medical history and genetics "may be able to help identify people who are at especially high risk from infection. That knowledge could help those people better shield themselves from infection and get quicker access to treatment and vaccines, if necessary."

In an effort to combat the spread of COVID-19, health officials are preparing for a fall and winter vaccine rollout with omicron-specific boosters to target a more up-to-date version of the virus. The rollout could start <u>as early as September</u>.

The US Food and Drug Administration last month made a <u>recommendation</u> that vaccine manufacturers should make a booster dose of COVID-19 vaccine that targets the <u>BA.4 and</u> <u>BA.5 subvariants</u> of the omicron variant. BA.5 now makes up <u>the majority</u> of COVID-19 cases in the US and is leading another summer surge of COVID-19 cases.

The pressure on the timeline to come up with a new vaccine comes partly from talk about expanding the eligibility of who can get a second booster of the currently available vaccines (only adults 50 and older and younger immunocompromised people are eligible for a second booster, and the eligibility isn't likely to be extended until there's a new booster, The New York Times <u>reports</u>). The pressure also extends to the vaccine companies, specifically Moderna and Pfizer, which need to make sure their vaccines are ready before being authorized by the FDA and endorsed by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
