### **LATEST NEWS** (Today)

Unfortunately, COVID-19 and its variants are not likely to disappear any time soon. COVID predictions are leaning toward an endemic, meaning the virus will become familiar and seasonal like the cold or flu. COVID will probably transition from a pandemic to an endemic in 2023, which is good and bad news. In the future endemic, weaker variants may mean fewer deaths, but the number of deaths that will still occur could be staggering. Although we consider Omicron to be less deadly, it has caused more deaths than the Delta variant. This is because Omicron spreads more rapidly. Deaths aren't the only negative aspect of endemic COVID.

Long COVID symptoms are another severe consequence of allowing this virus to spread unchecked. Infected people who survive their illness may bear lifelong symptoms such as fatigue, headaches, and loss of smell or taste.

Although the COVID endemic predictions may feel discouraging, everyone must maintain hope and continue fighting this disease.

If Americans decide too soon that the battle with COVID is "over," we could drag this virus with us forever. The virus may become part of our everyday lives, but limiting hospitalizations, deaths, and long COVID illness cases is still crucial.

### **Latest News (WebMD News)**

The Covid-19 vaccine has changed the course of the pandemic. In total, 161 doses have been given for every 100 people around the world. In countries that reached the highest levels of vaccination, <u>death rates plummeted</u>.

Amid this progress, the world was caught off guard when the omicron variant rose to prominence in late 2021. Omicron proved somewhat less severe than previous variants, but it spread much faster.

Millions of vaccinated people have gotten sick from the omicron strain, but the shots served their most important function—preventing severe illness. During the omicron wave, vaccination with a booster reduced the chance of <a href="https://docs.pitalization.org/">hospitalization and death</a> by <a href="more than 90%">more than 90%</a>. Sudden spikes of cases from the fast-moving variant have pressured health systems, but the outlook for the average Covid patient has improved significantly.

#### September 11 – Windermere Memorial

Today we tell the story of Jeff Cox, Paul Harris Fellow, son of Rotarian Dale and Margaret Cox.

Jeff was a member of the Eagle Scouts, and who at the age of 15 in 2011 won the National Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year award for the Boy Scouts of America.

He also won the National Glenn and Melinda Adams Award for the best service project out of 55,000 applicants, the

Orange County Citizen of the Year for District 1 and an all expense paid trip to London to meet Parliament and then Mayor Boris Johnson.

His story started at a summer camp, when he heard that it was possible to get a piece of the World Trade Center and to build a Memorial and that is what he did.

Gary Bruhn, the Mayor of the Town of Windermere at the time, helped find a quiet and secluded place near the Windermere Library and decided that was going to be the place for it. Jeff presented the project to the Town Council and got approval. The Rotary Club of Windermere supported his project financially.

Over 2000 volunteer hours were documented on this project, and many boy scouts helped paint the tiles that were placed over the side of the monument. There is a tile for every Country showing the International laws and also for those who lost a loved one. There are tiles representing the firefighters, the Pentagon, and the Police Officers who lost their lives as well. The granite was a donation.

During the many calls to the Port Authority, Jeff was given 7 options of pieces to choose from, and he chose this piece of steel in particular because of the rip in the middle and the twisted nuts on the side.

Jeff lived in Breckenridge, Colorado after high school graduation, graduated from Rollins College and came back home, where he lives now selling solar panels.

The monument stands close to the Windermere Pubic Library and Town Hall, and is visited by many people every year.

On this day, we remember the lives lost and the community that came together to help one another at such difficult time.


